This project was in response to an effort to maintain Jesuit spiritual ministries in Southern California after the closing of Manresa Retreat House in Azusa. A staff of five people would inaugurate this organization led by Fr. Allan and four others: Rev. Michael J. Mandala, SJ, Rev. Joseph T. Nguyen, SJ, Danielle Harper and Lupe Amézquita.

# A Year of Service

April marks the first year anniversary of Sister Barbra Ostheimer's membership on the Loyola Institute team. She has embraced a whirlwind of activities building on Father Chi Ngo's fine work with the Ignatian Spiritual Formation Program. That program continues to flourish with a growing number of students in our

evening spirituality courses, new recruits for the associates program and a successful year-long program of Spiritual Exercises in Everyday Life (also called the Nineteenth Annotation Retreat).

But it doesn't end there. Sister Barbra has supervised the English Spiritual Ministry Network (SMN) pilot program that began last September. She and her team of associates have trained parish-based spiritual

leaders in giving mini-retreats called Days of Prayer in several parishes during Advent and Lent. Father Tacho Rivera, S.J., has supervised the Spanish program which has done the same at several parishes.

What stands out in Sister Barbra's work is her energy and sensitivity to our students and associates. Of particular note is the help LIS has been able to give to Vietnamese and Korean groups in both Orange and Los Angeles Counties. LIS has trained a growing number of leaders from those communities who were able to study with us in English, but minister in their own languages. We are especially proud of LIS's ability to relate to the complicated cultural and language reality of Southern California. Sister Barbra brings many years of experience with international communities in Rome to her ministry and it shows in the results!

As we celebrate Easter and the central mystery of our Christian faith, the Resurrection, my prayer is that we all follow what

gives us life, that is, discern with an open heart and mind where it is that the Lord continues to lead us in His gentle, loving way. Happy Easter!

El padre Tacho Rivera, S.J. ha supervisado el programa en español y ha hecho el mismo trabajo en varias iglesias.

Lo que destaca en el trabajo de la hermana Barbra es su energía y sensibilidad hacia nuestros estudiantes y asociados. Un punto en especial es la ayuda que LIS ha podido dar a grupos en las comunidades vietnamita y coreana tanto en el condado de Orange como en el de Los Ángeles. ## April Overview of the Month


As our Lenten journey comes to a close we prepare to follow Christ all the way to the cross and to witness His glorious Resurrection. Hopefully we have sacrificed and prayed so that we are now able to more fully reap the fruits of a well spent Lent. After our solemn commemoration of the last days and death of Our Lord we will spend the remainder of the month celebrating. As Spring breaks forth even nature will join us as buds and blooms begin to surface and we spend this month basking in the joy of the Resurrection. We continue throughout the entire month our cry, "Christ is risen, Christ is truly risen."

## Book Review

The wisdom of St. Ignatius spoken of in the title is, of course, the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius and this book is Dean Brackley's interpretation of them. Jesuits have been writing this kind of book for centuries. Many are pious, run-of-the-mill productions. A few are exceptional; and I believe this is one of them. The "Foreword for Skeptics" alone is worth the price of the book. Ellen Calmus, a friend of Brackley and the copyeditor of the book, was not what you would call a believer and took the job with no real interest in religion. But the text chipped away at her unbelief, and one Christmas eve, when having nothing in particular to celebrate she was working on the copy, the light dawned and her life changed. A year later she was baptized by the author. This will probably not be the average reaction to the book, but it is worth reading. The author is a man of intelligence, learning and insight steeped in Ignatian spirituality and he speaks from a depth far beyond mere words with a new and fresh voice in a way that might be heard by the post-modern seeker. As Professor of Theology and Ethics at the University of Central American since 1990 and a successor of the Jesuits martyred there the previous year, he might be expected to stress the social justice dimension of the Exercises. And he does, but in so gentle fashion that he opens up possibilities without imposing guilt trips on the reader. Brackley is faithful to the teaching of Ignatius, but offers even those familiar with the Exercises new insights and perspectives. The book will be particularly useful for those giving or making or studying the Spiritual Exercises.


