WRITER'S AWARD IN SPIRITUALITY

REV. RICHARD HAUSER, S.J., S.T.L., PH.D.

Fr. Richard Hauser has been a dynamic, nationally recognized leader in Jesuit spirituality for over 45 years. He was a founder of the esteemed masters in spirituality degree at Creighton University.

Ordained in 1968, he earned a licentiate in Sacred Theology (St. Louis U., 1968) and a doctorate in Religious Education (Catholic University of America, 1973). He has been a theology professor at Creighton University since 1972. He is currently professor emeritus, and is assistant to the president for mission. Fr. Hauser has published numerous articles on theology and spirituality and has authored three books: *In His Spirit: A Guide to Today's Spirituality, Moving in the Spirit: Becoming a Contemplative in Action,* and *Finding God in Troubled Times*. In his writings, Fr. Hauser examines the topics that Catholics grapple with on a daily basis, including the unique role of the Holy Spirit and understanding the suffering humans experience.

On May 5, Fr. Hauser will give a three-hour, interactive workshop at St. Timothy's Parish in Laguna Niguel.
